Camp Restore Detroit is:

As is often the case, many good things happen by accident. Camp Restore New Orleans was formed in 2006 in response to Hurricane Katrina and the levee failures that followed. No one imagined where our work would lead us, even taking root over a thousand miles north of New Orleans in Detroit. It isn't a stretch to call Detroit the heart of the United States, and New Orleans our soul. These two cities, bearing names that remind us of their French origins and more than 600 years of combined history, are now home to an effort by everyday Americans to restore faith, home and community in the Name of Jesus. What began as hurricane relief has grown into efforts to address large-scale systemic challenges, such as restoring the wetlands that protect against hurricanes, supporting local schools and youth programs and helping new, innovative community nonprofits get off the ground. We achieve this through partnerships with more than 150 fellow nonprofits and churches. Since 2006, over 30,000 volunteers from all 50 States, Puerto Rico and dozens of countries have called Camp Restore home. The results of their 1,000,000-plus hours of service are visible all around us, and not just in Detroit and New Orleans.

Human Care:

There are many opportunities to work with our community at Camp Restore Detroit! Relationships are key to our ministry and partnership with our community!

Past projects include:

- Working with children in tutoring programs
- Vacation Bible Schools in the 9th Precinct
- Sharing cards, visits, and singing at nursing homes
- Joining an art class to build floats for a neighborhood parade
- Soup kitchens, clothing and food pantries
- Camp Restore Detroit is beginning our own art and tutoring programs for adult and children

Environmental:

Driving through the east side of Detroit, one will discover many abandoned houses. These houses are a public health and safety hazard. Many have been torn down by the city of Detroit, leaving empty lots which are overgrown, unsafe, and become a dumping ground for trash. Together with our community, we are tackling blight.

Once a lot is cleared, block leaders encourage residents to mow and care for lots adjacent to their houses.

Another environmental service is helping with community gardens. We are beginning our own community garden on Camp Restore Detroit's campus. We are excited to give families their own garden areas and an opportunity for fresh vegetables! CRD is also creating a non-edible garden. The Spring Garden Haven will house an amphitheater, flower gardens, pathways, benches, and much more. CRD's art outreach program will be making creations to go into the garden!
